CALL FOR PAPERS

Artificial Intelligence and Languages

Artificial intelligence has been the subject of studies and research for at least seven decades. However, the recent enhancement of AI resources, especially generative AI trained with large amounts of data, seems to have had a significant impact not only on various aspects of society but also on various areas of knowledge, including language-related studies.

In this publication, we are interested in gathering works that propose and problematize possible dialogues between the fields of artificial intelligence and languages. Examples of possible dialogues: AI, education, and school; AI, teaching, and learning; AI and literacy; AI and teacher training; AI and instructional material design; AI and editing; AI and translation; AI and corpus linguistics; AI and literature; AI and critical pedagogies; ethical implications of AI in the context of language and languages, and more.

In this way, we hope to build networks, encourage exchanges, stimulate reflections, learn, make others aware, and ultimately contribute to the development and improvement of our scientific work in the areas of AI and languages, considering them in dialogue. Guidelines for Writing/Submitting Chapters

- 1. Purpose and Scope of the Publication: The publication aims to bring together texts related to the areas of languages and artificial intelligence, considering possible dialogues and convergences.
- 2. Deadline and Submission Method: The texts should be submitted by February 10, 2024, using the following form: https://forms.gle/kCbLMjEzUu1kQyXEA
- 3. Co-authored Works: Co-authored works are allowed. In this case, one of the authors should submit the work and provide the names and information of all co-authors.
- 4. Formatting Guidelines for Chapters
 - 4.1. Original manuscripts should be in .doc, .docx (Word), or .odt (Writer LibreOffice or equivalent) file formats. In english, portuguese or italian.
 - 4.2. Articles should be between 15 and 20 pages, using A4 paper size with margins of 3.0 cm on the top and left, and 2.0 cm on the bottom and right, including references, attachments, and appendices.
 - 4.3. Texts should be written in Times New Roman (Word) or Liberation Serif (Writer LibreOffice), size 12, with 1.5 line spacing.
 - 4.4. Include an abstract of up to 250 words, using Times New Roman (Word) or Liberation Serif (Writer LibreOffice), size 10, and single-line spacing.
 - 4.5. Include 3 keywords immediately after the abstract, using the same font and size.
 - 4.6. Use an author-date citation system.
 - 4.7. For quotations longer than three lines, footnotes, references, captions for illustrations, tables, and charts, use single spacing.
 - 4.8. For quotations longer than three lines, use a 4 cm indentation from the left margin, with font size 10 and no quotation marks.
 - 4.9. Footnotes should be explanatory, limited to 3 lines.
 - 4.10. Tables, charts, graphs, and figures should have titles above and sources below.
 - 4.11. The section title for references should be "References."
 - 4.12. Review the text to ensure that all cited authors are included in the References section.
- 5. Author Mini-biographies: Provide separate documents with author mini-biographies, in a font matching the body of the text (item 4.3), and containing a maximum of 10 lines. Focus on academic/professional profiles. These may be published along with the chapter.
- 6. Submission Conditions The text must:
 - 6.1. Align with the general theme, "Artificial Intelligence and Languages," considering its various aspects.

- 6.2. Be original. Note: Self-plagiarism constitutes a loss of originality. If self-citations are necessary, authors are encouraged to cite themselves.
- 7. Evaluation of Submitted Texts Submitted texts will be peer-reviewed and may or may not be accepted. Authors will be informed of the results via email.

8. Final Considerations

By submitting their text, authors:

- a) Take responsibility for the accuracy of citations, data, personal information, and academic degrees declared and presented.
- b) Commit to avoiding any form of plagiarism in their text, including texts generated by artificial intelligence. If AI is used, it must be referenced.
- c) Acknowledge that there will be no remuneration for authors, and no fees will be charged to authors.
